

These questions can be used to consolidate learning after undertaking tree, seeds and woodland focussed activites. They can be used as tie-breaker questions for seed germination activities or as a true or false activity.

Question	Answer	Did you know?
What tree has a seed that is known as a conker?	Horse Chestnut	Horse chestnut leaves can be used to make a soapy substance by soaking in water and agitating.
What tree has seeds that act like helicopters?	Sycamore	Eating the seeds of the sycamore tree can causes muscle damage as they contain the toxic agent hypoglycin A.
What tree has leaves that are used for Christmas decorations	Holly	Most holly trees are "planted" by birds who excrete the seeds after eating the berries.
What tree has a seed known as an acorn?	Oak	Acorns can be used to make a coffee like drink and can be turned into flour.
What is the only native British broadleaf tree to produce pinecones?	Alder	Alder trees produce a green dye that was used to colour and camouflage the clothes of outlaws like Robin Hood.
What tree produces a nut that is used to make chocolate and hazeInut spread e.g. Nutella?	Hazel	Hazel is so bendy in spring that it can be tied in a knot without breaking.
What tree has a seed that we roast and eat usually at Christmas?	Sweet Chestnut	Sweet chestnuts were brought to Britain by the Romans as a food source.
What tree produces a seed known as a mast?	Beech	Beech leaves used to be used for medicinal purposes such as reducing swelling.
